Project #2 Organize Your Speech

- * Select an appropriate outline which allows listeners to easily follow and understand your speech.
- * Make your message clear, with supporting material directly contributing to the message.
- * Use appropriate transitions when moving from one idea to another.
- * Create a strong opening and conclusion.

Project #7 Research Your Topic

- * Collect information about your topic from numerous sources.
- * Carefully support your points and opinions with specific fact, examples and illustrations gathered through research.

Project #10 Inspire Your Audience

- * Inspire the audience by appealing to noble motives and challenging the audience to achieve a higher level of beliefs or achievements.
- * Appeal to the audience's needs and emotions, using stories, anecdotes and quotes to add drama.
- * Avoid using notes.
